RE: *Public Interest Disclosure Act: 2023 Annual Report on Disclosures of Wrongdoings*


Effective December 1, 2022, the jurisdiction of the *Public Interest Disclosure Act* (PIDA) was extended over several public bodies, including the Civil Resolution Tribunal (CRT). PIDA provides a framework for employees to report specific kinds of serious wrongdoing with legislated protection from reprisal. Section 38 of PIDA requires the CRT to report annually on all wrongdoings made in the past year.
