



If an injury is minor, there is a limit on the amount of damages for pain and suffering.

On or after May 1, 2021. In most cases you can't make a claim against a person or organization for personal injury or vehicle damages. In limited exceptions such as when an accident was caused by an impaired driver, you might be able to make a claim with the CRT.

For vehicle damage or personal injuries up to \$50,000.

Fault & Damages

Minor Injury Determination

If an injury is minor, there is a

limit on the amount of damages

for pain and suffering.

SC

Small Claims up to \$5,000.

These claims are typically against ICBC for reimbursement of a deductible, vehicle repairs, or increased premiums paid.

You can also claim against a driver for damage to property other than a vehicle.



In small claims, the limitation period is typically 2 years from the date of the accident.

This type of claim must include a monetary claim.

The CRT can determine responsibility to make an order for damages, but cannot order ICBC to change its responsibility assessment.

Small Claims up to \$5,000.

These claims are typically against the other driver for damage to vehicle, and business losses.

If you don't agree with ICBC's decision about responsibility for an accident, you must prove that ICBC acted unreasonably or improperly in assigning responsibility for the accident.

You cannot include a monetary claim.

The deadline to make your CRT claim is within 90 days of the date of ICBC's CL 722 letter.
